WHO ARE WE VOTING OUT? MARTHA MCSALLY (R)



Martha McSally was appointed to fill the last two years of the late Senator John McCain's seat by Gov. Doug Ducey. Prior to that, she served in the House of Representatives for 4 years. Previously, McSally served for 26 years in the U.S. Air Force. She is pro-life and supports repealing and replacing Obamacare. She is an unabashed Trump supporter; she

warms up the crowds at his rallies and votes in agreement with Trump 95.4% of the time. (source)

- League of Conservation Voters (LCV) Victory Fund listed McSally as a 'Dirty Dozen" candidate: a list of the most anti-environment candidates
- Voted 'no' to several important climate action bills to prevent the expansion of fossil fuels, EPA overreach, and more.

Since my first day in Congress, I've been fighting to roll back this burdensome rule and I applaud the Trump Administration for allowing commonsense to prevail by returning the onus of water and land rights where it belongs: the states." - Supports Repeal and Replace Affordable Care Act (ACA)
- Found 'Mostly False' on campaign claim that she is leading efforts to protect persons with pre-existing conditions from insurance coverage discrimination by PolitiFact
- Voted in favor of the American Healthcare Act
- Voted to repeal Medicaid Provisions and Expansion by lowering the qualifying poverty level
- Allow states to impose a work requirement for those seeking Medicaid

Human Rights



- Voted FOR an amendment (H.R. 3055) that would exclude transgender service members from receiving benefits from healthcare coverage
- However, in 2013 speech when advocating for women's rights to serve she said, "[...] our nation is the strongest when we have the most capable people serving [...] we are inconsistent when we say we want people to have freedom of opportunity except when it goes against what we personally believe." - Voted to bar Planned Parenthood (and other orgs like it) from receiving any federal funds

Criminal Justice



Supported Trump's vice chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff nominee, Air Force Gen. John Hyten after allegations of sexual assault. He was confirmed to the vice chair role, one in which he would be responsible for looking into allegations of misconduct. While the report cited insufficient evidence, McSally said, "The truth is that General Hysten is innocent of these charges." (source)

Mark Kelly is a retired US Naval combat pilot (First Gulf War and Operation Desert Storm), engineer, and NASA astronaut. He is married to former Congresswoman Gabby Giffords, who was shot in an attempted assassination. He and Gabby co-founded Giffords: Courage to Fight Gun Violence after the Sandy Hook school shooting. He is an advocate for science, climate research, and sensible gun control.



WHAT'S ON THE BALLOT?


VETO REFERENDUM: Determining whether Colorado will join the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact (NPVIC) is on the ballot. States in the NPVIC agree to give their electoral votes for the presidential candidate that wins the most votes nationwide if the compact goes into effect. A veto referendum is a type of measure put on the ballot through citizen signature petition in an effort to repeal a law recently passed by the legislature. The National Popular Vote veto referendum is the first veto referendum to be certified for the Colorado ballot since 1932.

Citizen Initiative: Add addition to the constitution to specify that only U.S. citizens may vote. Similar measures are on the ballot in Alabama and Florida.

Citizen Initiative: Reintroduce gray wolves on public lands.

Measure: Authorize the state to issue transportation revenue anticipation notes (TRANs)—a specific type of bond debt—in the amount of \$1.837 billion.



John Hickenlooper is an American businessman and geologist who was the mayor of Denver from 2003 to 2011, and the 42nd governor. In 2019, Hickenlooper campaigned for the 2020 Democratic nomination for President but dropped out before any primaries were held. He is a climate champion, helped get cannabis legalized in his state, and supports common-sense gun law.

WHO ARE WE VOTING OUT? DAVID PERDUE (R)

David Perdue has served as a Republican senator to Georgia since 2015. His cousin is currently the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture. Perdue votes in agreement with Trump 94.6% of the time (<u>source</u>), and he was one of 22 senators who personally urged Trump to leave the Paris Agreement. According to the Center for Responsive Politics, Perdue has received over \$180,000 from oil, gas, and coal interests since 2012. (<u>source</u>)





Since 2013, he has been managing partner and CEO of Insight TWI, a small business based in the UK which produces investigations targeting corrupt officials and organized crime for international news organizations. He is endorsed by beloved civil rights activist and Congressperson John Lewis.



In Kentucky, citizens do not have the power to initiate state-wide initiatives or referendums. As of 2019, voters of Kentucky had never voted on a ballot measure to authorize a state-wide initiative and referendum process (<u>source</u>). If 60% of the membership of each chamber of the Kentucky General Assembly approves, a proposed amendment goes on the ballot at the next general election during which members of the state legislature are up for election (<u>source</u>).

Mitch has been in office since 1985 and is the U.S. Senate majority leader. He has set records for the number of judicial nominees confirmed during the first two years of a presidency. His wife is Elaine Chao, the U.S. Secretary of Transportation. He considers it a badge of honor to be called "The Grim Reaper of Bills" and says his proudest moment was denying Obama's Supreme Court Justice nomination. While he's served as a Senator for Kentucky, they have spent the most money on infrastructure of any state. He votes in agreement with Trump 94% of the time. (sourcce)




