Foster Boy: The Story

Michael Trainer is a lawyer at the center of a trial in which a for-profit foster care agency is accused of putting a known sex offender into the same foster home as his young client Jamal, with catastrophic results. Michael, a successful litigator with a long career protecting corporate interests, at first wants nothing to do with Jamal's case, until a judge forces him to accept it. Initially he sees Jamal as a kid off the street looking to grab a piece of corporate profits. But when Jamal refuses to settle the case for any amount of money, Michael begins his representation in earnest. As their work together reveals the horrifying depth of the corrupt and abusive for-profit foster care agency, Michael is transformed from cynical skeptic to fierce warrior in the pursuit of justice.

Foster Care: A Matter of Basic Civil Rights

In the US, thousands of foster youth are frequently revictimized while in the system, after being originally neglected and abused. They are voiceless and invisible, transitory and mostly unrepresented. They do not cast a shadow economically or politically. As a result, they are in no position to advocate for their own rights.

A system designed to protect them is often badly broken and too often goes unchallenged. Our shared failure to protect and support these kids means they often face harrowing, unsafe situtations and lack the encouragement, role modeling, life skills, love and confidence necessary to become safe, productive adults and break the cycle of hopelessness.

Each of us needs to learn more, reach out, and demand reform of this broken system.

Foster Boy is based on true events - it is about courage, an unlikely friendship and a tireless search for justice, and it shines a bright light on the very real abuses in the for-profit segment of the foster care system, widely recognized, including by U.S. Senate investigations. Deratany and Samuelson hope that the film will help raise awareness of the daunting challenges faced by all youth in foster care, and the need to help them because they are our responsibility.

Studies show fewer than three percent of foster youth earn a college degree. Each year, more than 20,000 youth age out of foster care, and within two years, more than half are homeless, incarcerated, on drugs or on welfare.

"There are an estimated 400,000 children in foster care in America," Deratany noted. "They are basically unrepresented, with few ways to shape their destinies. Why? One simple reason: they are children. They have no money and they have no voice."

"As long as kids keep getting abused in the system, I'm going to keep fighting for them," Deratany said. "We need more foster families and more money to be pushed in the right direction." Jay Paul Deratany is an accomplished lawyer, human rights activist, and foster youth advocate who uses his intense experiences in the legal system to cultivate his projects as a playwright and a screenwriter. He has spent his entire career pursuing justice for the vulnerable and creating change in our society, and currently serves as a board member for Human Rights Watch and is a 2020 inductee to the Chicago LGBT Hall of Fame. Jay founded The Deratany Firm today known as Deratany & Kosner - which consistently secures historic and life-changing results for its clients. That success includes winning a historic \$45,000,000 verdict in a foster care wrongful death case as well as the thenlargest jury verdict in Lake County history, \$23,000,000, in a birth injury case.

Mr. Deratany obtained his MFA from the University of California Riverside. He has written several plays, including Haram Iran, which was inspired by a true story about two 15-year-old Iranian boys who were hanged for being gay. Haram Iran was nominated for a GLAAD award for best theatrical play of 2011. Mr. Deratany has written two feature films: Saugatuck Cures and Foster Boy. Foster Boy, which has an upcoming theatrical and VOD release on September 25th, 2020, stars Academy Award Winner® Louis Gossett Jr., Matthew Modine, Shane Paul McGhie, Julie Benz, Shane Paul McGhie, and others. It is written and produced by Jay Paul Deratany and executive produced by Shaquille O'Neal. The film spotlights some of the horrific abuse and institutional coverups that plague the foster care system - moral and legal issues that he has fought against in the courtroom. He resides in Chicago with his husband.
